



Requirements to Receive IFC Graduate Reimbursement Scholarship

An applicant must provide:

- Receipt/payment for the graduate exam
- Proof that exam was completed by sharing an email from testing center or other forms of evidence that prove you took the exam
 - IMPORTANT: You must prove you took the exam, however, we do not need to see your exam score. We only need to see proof that you took the exam, so you may blur your exam score if you wish to submit this form of evidence
- Failure to prove that you took your exam will result in a termination of your application and you will no longer be considered for the scholarship

In your responses:

- You must provide a detailed response for all questions in order to be considered for the scholarship
 - What is required?
 - Respond to all of the following:
 - What have you done for the IFC community? (IFC, IFC J-Board, your own chapter's executive board)
 - What is your future career path?
 - Why do you want to enter this field?
 - How has your fraternal experience helped shape your career path and or your professional development?
 - How does graduate school help you reach your future career goals?
 - Why do you think you deserve this scholarship?

Evaluation Process:

- After making sure all questions are answered and submitted, responses will be reviewed by a committee board that consists of the IFC President, Vice President of Scholarship and Service and an FSA member.
- If your responses meet the criteria, you will be considered to be a recipient of an amount decided upon by the board
 - NOTE: The board may decide to pay for the full price or half price of the expense
- If chosen, the IFC's Vice President of Scholarship and Service will reach out to you through the email provided in your application
